

SOUTHERN JUTLAND AUGUST 22-25 2024 Meeting & General Assembly

In Bugatti Club Denmark we have the ambition to explore and experience all corners of the Danish kingdom with our faithful cars. Since the club's rebirth in 2018, we have thus already enjoyed exquisite roads in North Jutland, Central Jutland, on Funen, on Bornholm and in North Zealand. In total, we have driven around 2200 kilometers to date according to roadbooks and maps and in all kinds of weather.

So, on our next trip we will be visiting Southern Jutland, the beautiful borderland that is almost an inseparable part of Denmark's history and self-understanding; and a part of the country at the same time so very distinctive.

With some 450 km routes during the meeting, reaching from Jutland's east coast to the west coast, we will experience and enjoy all that which characterizes South Jutland: the landscape, the architecture, the culture, the craftsmanship, the language, the food - and the people.

The event starts Thursday 22 August and ends on Sunday 25 August. We will all be staying at the modern Hotel Sønderborg Strand; located in front row it offers short distance to the town center, all the restaurants, the harbour promenade, the beach and the famous castle. The hotel will reserve a space for our cars - and the bar is open every evening.

PROGRAM

THURSDAY, AUGUST 22 - ARRIVAL & AGM

Thursday we'll meet around 1-2 pm -14 at Petersen Tegl A/S, where it is possible to unload and park trailers (exact address and meeting tbd). Trailers are not allowed at the hotel.

Petersen Tegl has kindly invited us to hold our annual general meeting (AGM) at 3 pm at their premises.

We then have a short drive to the hotel in Sønderborg, where later on aperitifs and welcome dinner will be served.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 23 - 165 km

The day starts with a visit to the brick company Petersen Tegl. Since its foundation in 1791 the company is still owned and lead by the same family and now export bricks to more than 55 countries worldwide. We then pass through Aabenraa on our way to Løjt Land for lunch at the excellent Restaurant Knapp.

After lunch small roads lead us past Kalvø, Genner beach and back to Aabenraa. Here we will visit Marcussen & Søn, who since 1806 have built and restored church organs all over the world. On the way home we stop at Nydambåden, a recently built reconstruction of a Viking boat dating back from 320 AD. The original boat was excavated in 1863 in the nearby Nydam Moor.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 24 - 200 km

The day starts along Flensburg Fjord's coast with a magnificent view of Glücksborg and Flensburg. We leave the coast and follow good but rarely used roads to the idyllic Møgeltønder, where we have lunch at Schackenborg Castle Inn.

We then head west into the marsh with a short break at the Vidå Lock and its great view out over the Wadden Sea. The route continues through Højer and further on to one of the Christian strongholds of medieval Denmark, Løgumkloster monastery. From there a long eastbound stretch takes us to the inn of Krusmølle, where a coffee break awaits us. The way back towards Sønderborg leads us through Gråsten, famous for the Gravenstein apple and Gråsten Castle.

We check out and drive to the South of Als, where we visit Vibæk Water Mill from 1756. We continue up along the island's east coast with a stop at Taksensand Lighthouse, from where you have a fine view over the Little Belt to Funen.

The final stage to Northern Als leads through Nordborg – passing another castle - and to the beautifully situated Dyvig Badehotel, where we park on the harbor front - and can breathe a sigh of relief enjoying the final lunch. Here the meeting officially ends.

Those who need to return to a trailer at Petersen Tegl can take the short ferry crossing Hardeshøj - Ballebro (prebooking not necessary), the fastest route to the brickworks. If you wish to return to Sønderborg (31 km), it can be worthwhile to drive down via Als.
